Mayors Message

Summer is winding down and as we move into fall the Council agenda will focus on the upcoming Union of BC Municipalities meeting in late September in Vancouver. We have requested meetings with various Ministers and ministries to advance our agenda. We are focusing our efforts on securing grants for infrastructure projects, road renewal and repair. We are also supporting resolutions sponsored by various municipalities to improve rural health care, protective services funding (fire-fighting equipment purchases) and a host of other services which over the last twenty years have been downloaded to municipalities.

We had a setback in the installation of new process control equipment for the water treatment facility. The prime contractor has pushed back the dates by 30 to 60 days. Public Works have done an outstanding job in keeping the treatment plant operating over the last 4 months.

Our new CAO, Danielle Myles Wilson is now on the job. She will be a great asset to the current team and will be able to implement the Council's agenda and vision.

Just a reminder to please clean up after your dogs and make sure they are on a leash in public spaces.

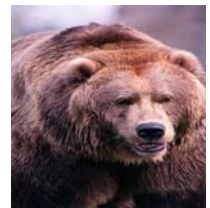
We all need to be respectful of others and do our part in keeping our community looking its best "Clean, Neat & Green".



Bear Aware

We would like to ask that all Port Edward Residents help out when it comes to keeping bears out of the community. Properly storing or securing residential garbage and other bear attractants is a proven method for discouraging bears and preventing nuisance problems around homes and neighborhoods.

- Bears are attracted to: Garbage Cans, Bird Feeders, Pet Food, BBQ Grills, Smokers, and Compost
- **If you see a bear:** remain calm, don't panic. Often the bear is simply looking for food and will move on if it finds nothing to eat.
- Keep away from the bear and go inside with children and pets.
- Never approach the bear and don't run from the bear.
- Do not act submissively by crouching down or whispering.
- Warn others of the bear's presence, but don't do it by yelling. If the bear climbs a tree, keep people and pets away. Eventually when things quiet down, the bear will come down and leave. This usually happens after dark when the bear feels safe.
- Once the bear is safely out of the area, check your yard to ensure there are no attractants available.
- If the bear is threatening, persistent or aggressive, call the Conservation Officer Service at 1-877-952-7277, your local police and the Municipal Office.
