PORT EDWARD VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT'S NEW TRUCK

The Port Edward Volunteer Fire Department (PEVFD) is finally proud to announce the arrival of their new fire truck! The truck arrived on January 26, 2025, and the volunteer firefighters received an orientation on all of the truck's features. On January 28, 2025, the volunteer firefighters performed a fire truck 'wet down ceremony' where the new truck was sprayed with water from a fire hose marking the official start of the new truck being put into service. This tradition is a way to dedicate the truck to the community and to honour the firefighter's commitment to protecting it. The plan for the old truck is to remain as part PEVFD's fleet.

TRANSPARENCY IN MUNICIPAL RECORDS — OIPC REPORT HIGHLIGHTS

The Office of the Information and Privacy Commissioner for BC (OIPC) recently released Investigation Report 25-01, examining how municipalities across BC manage public access to records. The report highlights inconsistencies in Freedom of Information (FOI) processes, proactive disclosure, and records available for purchase, impacting transparency and accessibility for residents.

Key findings include:

- ✓ Variability in FOI request processing and application fees across municipalities
- ✓ The need for more proactive disclosure to reduce unnecessary FOI requests
- ✓ Inconsistencies in which records are available for purchase and at what cost
- A call for municipalities to improve staff training on public access to records

The District of Port Edward is reviewing these findings to enhance its records management and public accessibility practices. To learn more about municipal transparency and access to information, visit oipc.bc.ca.



REEF Project Construction Progress: Feb. 20, 2025

- Uplands:
 - Continue with overburden removal and fill placement
 - Continuing with rock drilling and blasting in work areas
- Rail Road and Utilities Corridor (RRUC)
 - Continue with overburden removal in North, East and South RRUC
 - Continue with fill placement East RRUC
 - Continue rock crushing and aggregate production
 - Rail offloading pedestals Complete
 - Start 69 kV relocation scope
- Permanent Concrete Works:
 - Continue with Balance of Plant (BOP) foundations work.

- Marine Updates
 - 3 Derricks are fully mobilized and operational.
 - Continued with falsework frame & pile installation on Piers 4, 5, 6, 7 & 8
- · Night shift activities
